## **Southern California Champions AGAIN!**

# <u>UCSD's Speech & Debate Team Captures Two First Place Sweepstakes Awards at Season's Capstone Tournament for the FOURTH CONSECUTIVE year!</u>

At the Pacific Southwest Collegiate Forensics Association's (PSCFA) *Spring Championships* Tournament, held on the campus of Moorpark College, February 23-25, the UCSD Speech & Debate Team dominated the tournament for the fourth year in a row.

The *Spring Champs* Tournament is the finale of the major, regional speech and debate tournaments of the 2023-24 season, sponsored by southern California's forensics governing body, PSCFA. The tournament offers all debate formats and speech events, invites schools from around the country, and offers four all-school-performance Sweepstakes Tournament Championship Awards. The first Sweepstakes Award went to the leading community college team, Moorpark College—an award for which UCSD was not eligible. Similarly, the second Sweepstakes Award was for the "small entry" schools, who entered few events, but performed well. This award—for which UCSD was also not eligible—went to Northern Virginia Community College. That left two First Place Sweepstakes Awards.

The UCSD Speech and Debate Team won both the **Novice Division First Place Sweepstakes Award** and the **First Place Four Year Schools Sweepstakes Award**. UCSD dominated the tournament by earning 165 sweepstakes points and besting second place Point Loma Nazarene University (68 points), third place Concordia University (45 points), fourth place CSU Long Beach (34 points), and fifth place CSU Fullerton (15 points).

This makes UCSD's Speech and Debate Team the Tournament Champion in 15 of the previous 17 major, regional tournaments attended. Thus, UCSD's 88% Tournament Championship win percentage over the last two seasons is very likely another historic record in the annals of the endeavor. There is no record of any middle school, high school, community college, nor university achieving such dominance in a region in interscholastic speech and debate.

At Spring Champs, the team's winning began Friday in the Novice Division of NPDA (two vs. two) debate. Lily Zhao and Dominic Feliton defeated Irvine Valley College to win the **First Place Gold Award**. In the Open (Senior) Division, the teams of Carter Castillo with Julian Mackenzie, and Felip Gerdes with Jared Hoffart both won **Third Place Bronze Awards**. NPDA Speaker Awards went to Julian Mackenzie (3<sup>rd</sup>, Open), Dominic Feliton (7<sup>th</sup>, Novice), Emily Bianchi (8<sup>th</sup>, Novice), Carter Castillo (8<sup>th</sup>, Open), and Srujam Dave (9<sup>th</sup>, Open).

Saturday's competition featured IPDA (one vs. one) debate. UCSD won big in all three divisions.

In the Novice Division of IPDA, Matthew Charry brought home **Second Place Silver**, while Marielle Lazaro, Brianna Newton, Dominic Feliton, and Zachary Reisner earned **Third Place Bronze**.

In the Junior Division of IPDA, both David Zheng and Saria Markes won **Second Place Silver Medals**, while Jiayi Hu and Karam Sodhi won **Third Place Bronze**.

In the Open Division, a table best displays UCSD's dominance.

The winning (and medals) continued Sunday during the third day of this marathon tournament with the Speech competitions. From 65 speech event entries, UCSD sent 21 to the elimination rounds. The following table depicts the results.
